



## FRANCIS SCOTT KEY BRIDGE COLLAPSE INCIDENT UPDATE 5/8/2024

Dear Valued Customer,

The Fort McHenry Limited Access Channel remains closed but is slated for reopening on or around May 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Efforts to remove the wreckage from the DALI have been underway since the temporary closure of the Fort McHenry Limited Access Channel. The complexity of removing the wreckage from the DALI necessitated the closure of this channel to ensure the safety of everyone in and around the area.

As a reminder, when this channel reopens the controlling depth will be 45 feet with 300-foot horizontal clearance. Commercially essential vessels will be able to utilize this channel when it reopens. Hours of operation of this channel are 8pm to 7am and will require approval from the Captain of the Port (COPT). To obtain permission to utilize this channel when it reopens you must contact the Marine Transportation System Recovery Branch at 505-203-8141 or email [MTSrecoveryMDNCR@uscg.mil](mailto:MTSrecoveryMDNCR@uscg.mil).

The sixth and last soul has been recovered from the wreckage. This is an important final step in bringing closure to the families of those who lost their lives in the tragic incident. We continue to keep them in our thoughts and prayers and wish them peace as they deal with the loss of loved ones.

We have received very welcome news from some of our customers that ocean carriers will begin to accept bookings to Baltimore starting the week of 5/13. We encourage you to reach out to your ocean carriers to explore options for new bookings to Baltimore in anticipation of the Federal Shipping Channel reopening at the end of May.
